

IR – to go

<p>yo voy</p> <p>= I go/am going/ do go</p>	<p>nosotros vamos nosotras } = we go/we are going/we do go</p>
<p>tú vas</p> <p>= you (inf.) go/are going/do go</p>	<p>vosotros vais vosotras } = you (pl.) go/are going/do go</p>
<p>usted (Ud.) } él } va ella } = you(form.) go/are going/do go = he goes/is going/does go = she goes/is going/does go</p>	<p>ustedes (Uds.) } ellos } van ellas } = you (pl.) go/are going/do go = they(m.) go/are going/do go = they (f.) go/are going/do go</p>

IR is an irregular verb like *ser* or *estar*.

It is almost always followed by the preposition *a* (to)
Voy a la escuela.

To ask where someone is going use *¿Adónde...?*

¿Adónde vas?

■ *Voy a la playa*

A common expression is *¡Vamos!* (Let's go!)

The future : Ir + a + infinitive

- Expresses an action you are going to do in the future
Voy a esquiar. (I am going to ski.)
